Our certified data destruction process includes background screening of employees, 24-7 video-monitored chain-of-custody at our processing facility, and additional independent verification of each batch, but we know there may still be a general concern. The manufacturer of your electronic equipment often provides instructions on the support section of their website to reset your device.
